Willis D. and Marjorie E. Hamilton Scholarship

Alumni and Friends of NSER Association are pleased to announce the establishment of the Willis D. and Marjorie E. Hamilton Scholarship. Management by the Association of the fund created for this purpose will provide for an annual award of no less than \$500.00 to the NSER graduate who has been accepted into a university program and who has attained the highest level of proficiency in written English.



Willis D. Hamilton is a 1953 graduate of NSER who attended UNB on a scholarship and later did post-graduate study there and in the US. In 1971, he was appointed to the UNB faculty where he was a teacher, researcher, and founding director of UNB's Micmac-Maliseet Institute. After retirement in 1992, he was made a Professor Emeritus of the university.

Professor Hamilton is also well known as a writer, being the author of more than 50 publications in the fields of literature, history, education, and native studies.

Marjorie E. (Wingfield) Hamilton was born in Calgary and grew up in Montreal. Prior to her retirement, she worked in the field of community development in Canada, the US, and Scotland.

The Hamiltons wish to encourage NSER graduates to recognize the importance of learning to write well, regardless of which career path they may choose to follow.



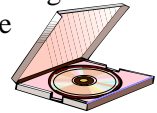
